Dear Sir,

Further to our letter of the 6th Day of June 1978, to you,  
we enclose herewith a letter for the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth  
of Australia, The Right Honourable Malcolm Fraser.

Wherein we have noted that by the conventions it states that  
communication shall be through the Swiss Federal Council, and we are as  
always most desirous of complying with the requirements of the convention,  
thus we forward this letter to you for transmission to The Right Honourable  
Malcolm Fraser, Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia.

We have already sent a letter exactly as is enclosed direct to the said  
Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia.

We most sincerely believe that the conventions are intentionally  
designed not only in respect to the manner and relations of dealing with  
prisoners of War, but also designed to suppress conflict from escalating,  
with a designed intent for Judiciary to be the mode of resolution.

We have always advocated this, and to this end we have and do  
make the official notification to your Federal Council.

We most sincerely trust that your Federal Council along with all other  
signatories to the Geneva Conventions of 12th August 1949 will convey to  
the Commonwealth of Australia that they are bound by the said conventions  
and the law of the Commonwealth of Australia to abide by the said conventions  
in all relative relations with this Principality. For we have complied  
with the requirements of the said convention and by the conventions and  
the Commonwealth law the conventions are bound to so apply.

We would be most pleased to receive confirmation of the said application  
of the said conventions either from or through your Federal Council.
