The Frontiersman started in 1904 as an intelligence unit associated with the armed forces and recognized by the war office. The members jumped to action at in Belgium at the start of World War I. Since then the Frontiersman have moved away from the military association and are now considered a volunteer group in their local community.

"The military side, as far as we are concerned, is gone," said Ridgedale Hutt River Chief Commissioner Barry Metcalf. "We have nothing to do with the military at all. We are a volunteer unit."

Metcalf and his wife Deputy Chief Commissioner Shirley moved from England to Canada about six years ago to be closer to family. They brought the Frontiersman organization across the ocean with them.

Metcalf has been a member of the Frontiersman in different orders around the globe since he was no longer needed in the military in 1991.

Metcalf and his wife eventually joined the Hellanshire Frontiersman in England which later became an independant UK order.


Albert Hillier received the Hallamshire Frontriersman Medal of Merit from the Hallamshire Frontiersman in England.
